For any Tier category: If clinician determines use of N95 is appropriate for any visit, clinician should wear N95.

***If unable to fit with N95, a KN95 or procedure mask are acceptable according to CDC emergency recommendations. PAPR units are also available at the Telecare Center and the Care Center. ***

N95 for nebulizing procedures or within 2 hours of procedure, CPAP, BiPap or trilogy ventilator
